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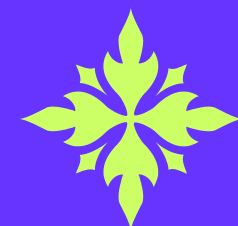

THE PROGRAM MISSION

The ACT Raising Safe Kids is a national anti-violence research-based program that mobilizes communities and educates families and caregivers to protect children and youth from violence before it occurs. The program achieves its goals by (a) establishing partnerships with organizations, coalitions, colleges, hospitals, and agencies; and (b) training professionals and other adults who work or are in regular contact with families.

1. THE CURRICULUM

The ACT program research-based curriculum is designed to help families and caregivers from all types of backgrounds raise children without violence by learning:

- ⇒ Basic information about child development
- ⇒ About risk factors for violence and its consequences
- ⇒ Protective factors and skills for effective parenting
- ⇒ About participating in the community's efforts on prevention

2. SETTINGS FOR THE PROGRAM

ACT can be implemented in diverse settings including childcare centers, family support organizations, hospitals, public libraries, houses of worship, correctional facilities, adult education centers, schools, community agencies, and shelters.

3. MATERIALS

Materials are available in English and Spanish and include the Facilitator manual, the parent handbook, fact sheets and handouts, brochures, the ACT TV PSA CD, and posters.

BENEFITS FOR ORGANIZATIONS AND PROFESSIONALS

- ⇒ Participation in a program that has been evaluated and shown to be a successful model for disseminating early violence prevention knowledge and skills to adults
- ⇒ Technical assistance from the American Psychological Association (APA) and local partners to help with program implementation and evaluation
